Our History

Esperance Sonshine Broadcasters Inc t/as 103.9HopeFM was founded on Christian principles by a small group of dedicated Christian men in 1997. Today,103.9HopeFM continues to broadcast and bring hope, share joy and build community.

Historical records of 103.9HopeFM indicates that the Community Radio station has operated with dedicated volunteers since its beginning. When first commencing the station had a few local broadcasters who had programs for a few hours per week, and the remainder of the week a rebroadcast program from 98.5SonshineFM was aired. Broadcasters and managers have come and gone as is common in Not-For-Profit Community Organisations. Maintaining the Christian foundation that was in place when 103.9HopeFM commenced broadcasting, the mission of the organisation to bring positive encouraging content to the local Esperance Community has continued. Over the past 23 years the numbers of broadcasters has increased, the power of our transmission has increased, and the number of computers, mics and the various equipment required for transmission has increased. We now operate with a live broadcast studio in addition to a recording studio, a caravan for outside broadcasting. and we have control 24/7 of what we schedule to broadcast. With a mix of local broadcasters, and externally downloaded programs from Vision Australia Radio with RPH programs and programs sourced through CMAA (Christian Media Association Australia) and CBAA (Community Broadcasting Association of Australia) and, our own automated program to fill in the times in between

The organisation operates with a flat organisational structure, entirely by volunteers. There is a Management Committee, which includes the Manager. The Manager has oversight of engaging volunteer staff and the day-to-day management of the station operation.

STRUCTURE & MANAGEMENT

Esperance Sonshine Broadcasters Inc T/as 103.9HopeFM is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) and is listed with ROCO (Register of Cultural Organisations) We hold tax deductible status for donations, and have been registered since 1997 as an incorporated association.

103.9HopeFM operates with a volunteer governance board, voted in to their position at an Annual General Meeting, or appointed by the board members as required throughout the year.

Day to day operations since October are currently overseen by Meredith Waters.

The remaining administrative and operational tasks are undertaken by a number of volunteers, who give their time, knowledge and skills regularly to ensure the station continues to operate successfully.

The year 2020 was one of upheaval and uncertainty due to the arrival of the Coronavirus and posed many challenges for the radio station such as the cancellation of many events, including fund raising and issues of cleaning the studios and equipment. Never the less I congratulate everyone involved in overcoming these obstacles and rising to the challenges presented and maintaining an excellent standard of broadcasting and community involvement.

Although COVID was disruptive it did give us the opportunity to host an online meeting via Zoom, which was a new experience and things have been kept running efficiently due in no small part to Meredith our

station manager, who seems to have an endless supply of energy, enthusiasm and organizing ability.

Sadly, we mourned the passing of former station manager and Board Chairperson Rob Griffiths, but also acknowledge the many positive changes he implemented, not least the Outside Broadcast Van which has been greatly utilized this past year to good effect.

Although fundraising was difficult, we did obtain some grant money to assist in dealing with Covid and through partnering with Esperance Community Arts on the Soundscape Workshop and the Digital Creation Hub. The Christmas Greetings campaign also helped in that regard and enabled non-sponsor businesses to try us out and no doubt to listen in!

Other successes have been the Radio Reading initiative, a wide range of programs, music and announcers and many excellent interviews. We have a great team making the most of limited resources and we have a great God who will continue to supply all our needs as we trust Him for the future. We can find encouragement in this paraphrasing of Joshua 1:9 " I have commanded you to be strong and brave , don't ever be afraid or discouraged , I am the Lord your God and I will be there, to help you wherever you go. "

Manager's Report Meredith Waters



Bringing hope, sharing joy, and building community. Whilst we might not ever reach the end of this mission – this past year has seen some wonderful examples of all of these at 103.9HopeFM.

Community radio in 2020 has been an interesting sector to be involved in. It provides a great place for people to express their creativity, share ideas, and connect into the broader community. It provides a platform for people to be heard. Community radio also provides a listening alternative that is interesting, local, and a point of connection to information, community groups and

people in general for our community.

For broadcasters it is an opportunity to develop skills and confidence. For everyone, it provided many opportunities for smiles and laughs, both broadcasters and listeners, and to keep connected through such an 'unprecedented year'!

Through the support of Community Broadcasting Foundation and The Shire of Esperance, we were successful in obtaining grant funding to update and increase our broadcasting equipment. Whilst these grants were applied for in 2019, it meant that we were able to continue broadcasting through 2020 being able to offer mics and headphones to volunteers to record from home when required. In addition, with the increase in volunteers, it was wonderful to have more equipment for people to use.

We continued to connect in the community as often as possible, with recording interviews with representatives of community groups such as Esperance Senior Citizens, CentreCare, Keep Esperance Beautiful, and people from local churches. Other groups and churches have accessed the airwaves as they have events to promote and information to share. We were very proud to be a source of credible, reliable information about Covid19. And, with needing to explore new ways of sharing information, we were a platform for local churches and community groups to inform the rest of the community about operating conditions. We were very honoured to broadcast the ANZAC day Dawn and morning services together with the Shire of Esperance and the RSL. And, for Easter, together with many of our local ministers to broadcast Good Friday and Easter Sunday Services for the community. In addition to these and our regular broadcasted program we also locally celebrated with special programs; Australia Day, Waitangi Day, Valentines' Day, Mothers' Day, Pentecost, Queens Birthday, Fathers' Day, Remembrance Day, Christmas and New Years' Eve.

With the aim of increasing not only the amount of local content, we also aim to increase the variety of content that we broadcast. Early 2019 saw the commencement of RPH programs – Radio for Print Handicapped These programs have continued to expand. We broadcast both externally downloaded RPH programs and produce our own Radio Reading Programs. A small but dedicated team of reading volunteers has seen us produce an hour of news reading each week, from January 2019. In September 2019 we also commenced Radio Reads in partnership with the Esperance Public Library. Mid year 2020 we increased to included another program "Lit in Esperance" – a program that broadcasts books written by Esperance Authors and books about Esperance.

During the year we embraced the opportunity to explore different ways of doing things. With many thanks to Esperance Community Arts, we were part of a collective of artists for a project that was hosted by Esperance Community Arts – the digital creation hub. The concept was how could we continue to be creative in changing times – we were very grateful to be included in this project and hopefully the learnings will continue to be of benefit to the

community. In addition, we provided some support to a Sound Scape project that was part of the Esperance Wildflower Festival. It was wonderful to be part of another creative community project hosted by Esperance Community Arts.

We couldn't do all we do without the constant support of our faithful sponsors. Particularly through such a challenging year, we truly appreciate all your support. To all our sponsors, we want to say a big Thank You!

We also operate entirely with volunteers. This year we clocked up at least a total of 10032 volunteer hours with 61 volunteers. Many volunteers commenced operating from home, and we also had 3 volunteers join us from other states. During Covid19 restrictions last year we discovered that if you could volunteer with 103.9HopeFM from home in our town, you could also volunteer from your home even if you lived in NSW or Victoria. I want to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers for their enthusiasm and dedication.

Last year we found an image/idea that clearly and easily communicates what 103.9HopeFM Community Radio is all about. The concept of a bridge. A bridge exists to provide the opportunity for two places to connect, that would not otherwise, without the existence of the bridge. This has been the perfect metaphor for our little community radio station. We exist to be the bridge between individuals, and groups that might not otherwise ever, have the opportunity to cross paths. This happens within 103.9HopeFM where we have student interns teaching and learning from retired folk. It happens when representatives from community groups and churches speak about and then listen to information from each other.

103.9HopeFM is a community radio station, with a strong Christian foundation. The bible story that best represents 103.9HopeFM as an organisation is the story when Jesus meets the woman at the well. It was an unexpected meeting, where both Jesus and the women shared what they had. The woman was not intending to meet anyone, but she met Jesus, and it changed her life for the better. 103.9HopeFM can be that place for unexpected meetings of ideas and people, and after the meeting, people are changed for the better. It really is as simple as that.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

The financial statements cover the business of ESPERANCE SONSHINE BROADCASTERS INCORPORATED T/A HOPE FM and have been prepared to meet the needs of stakeholders and to assist in the preparation of the tax return.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The Company is non reporting since there are unlikely to be any users who would rely on the general purpose financial statements.

The special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies described below and do not comply with any Australian Accounting Standards unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the company, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the company determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the business is entitled to it.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the company is entitled to it.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.






